Quarterly Report for April 1, 2005 to June 30, 2005

Implementation of SANREM CRSP Phase III activities has been launched as 18 Planning Awardees and another dozen unsupported teams have been traveling to host countries and preparing long-term participatory research programs in the four USAID-targeted regions. Management Entity efforts have been directed to contract and subcontract establishment as well as preparing awardees to meet with USAID officials in their targeted countries. This preparation has been amply rewarded as reports are coming in that planning awardees have been well received by USAID Missions. System Coordinators have increased the pace of work on Knowledge Base systems. All planned graduate students have now been recruited and are working on the various landscape systems portions of the Knowledge Base.

Other highlights: SANREM CRSP Systems Coordinators at North Carolina State University have collaborated in a training conference with the Soil Management CRSP. One Planning Awardee was contracted by USAID/Madagascar to conduct a rapid assessment of deforestation and restoration potentials in the Didy Forest. Three host country and 10 US graduate students and 1 host country and 3 US undergraduate students are currently being supported by system coordination, bridging, and planning activities. Weekly meetings are being held with the IPM CRSP to share lessons leaned, coordinate, search for synergy and approaches to solutions to common problems.

- Planning awardees commence meeting with host country counterparts and USAID/Mission officials, conducting site visits, and elaborating their research proposal strategies
- Converted the SANREM Knowledge Base Data Entry template to an on-line version consisting of an on-line data base for storage of knowledge-base meta data and resources.

Significant issues encountered and addressed

- Difficulties in identifying suitable and available candidates for the ERP continue to be addressed. The problem is finding candidates with research and development experience who have time and will accept our reimbursement rate.
- As planning award activities were initiated several awardees found it necessary to modify their travel plans.
 This entailed requesting changes to the approved travel authorizations by the USAID Contracts Officer.
 After four revisions were made the Contracts Officer noted that approvals were only needed when a new country was added to the list or there were changes in the budget. This will facilitate further travel modifications in the planning process.
- Initial partner unhappiness that they did not receive Planning Awards and lessons learned from the experience were discussed during the April Technical Committee teleconference.
